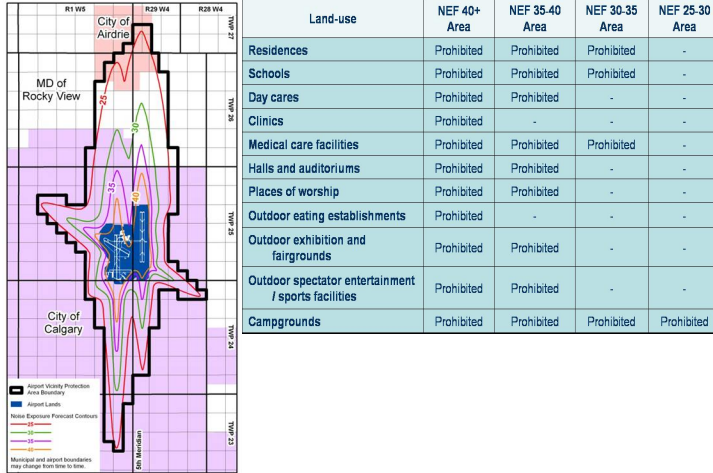

Update of the Calgary and Edmonton International Airport Vicinity Protection Area Regulations



Pryde Schropp McComb Inc. (PSMI) provided specialty consulting services related to the update of both the Edmonton and Calgary International Airport Vicinity Protection Area Regulations over the period 2003 to 2009. The work included updates to the Edmonton long-term Noise Exposure Forecast (NEF) contours and streamlining of the regulations to more efficient and consistent implementation by local planning officials. These updated regulations will ensure the long term protection of the public's use and enjoyment of lands around the airports with respect to long-term aircraft noise forecasts and new airport facilities including future runway expansions. The updated regulations focus on primary noise sensitive land uses and further streamline the administration and implementation of the regulation for municipal development officers.

PSMI was contracted by Alberta Municipal Affairs and worked directly with Stakeholder Technical Committees comprised of representatives as follows:
Calgary Regulation: the City of Calgary, Municipal District Rocky View, City of Airdrie and the Calgary International Airport Authority. **Edmonton Regulation:** City of Edmonton, County Leduc, City of Leduc and the Edmonton Airports.
