FEATURE PROJECT PROFILE

Saskatoon Apron I Infill and Expansion



Pryde Schropp McComb Inc. (PSMI) was retained by the Saskatoon Airport Authority to provide Planning, Engineering and Project Management services for Apron I Infill and Expansion projects which were completed in 2009.

The project was funded by the Saskatoon Airport Authority and initially involved the infill of 2,064 square metres of concrete on Apron I. Expansions to areas on the westside of Apron I were also constructed to provide more usable space for aircraft operations and make way for the proposed 2010 De-icing Facility Expansion. The total Apron I Expansion area constructed in 2009 surpassed 13,600 square metres.

PSMI's responsibilities included the planning and design of the infill/expansion areas, preparation of contract documents, and contract administration/supervision which included full time construction inspection. Quality assurance testing was coordinated and the results were reviewed to ensure the end product was constructed according with the the contract.

PSMI worked directly with the Airport Authority to ensure there was clear communication between all parties. Impacts to airport operations were minimized through a series of construction stages which ensured that the operators/carriers would be able to function without hindrance due to construction.
